

Summary of Hebrews 10 & The New Covenant

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Hebrews 10 & The New Covenant

Main Topic: Understanding Hebrews 10 and the New Covenant

- **Focus:** An in-depth exploration of Hebrews chapter 10 as part of a series on biblical covenants, specifically the New Covenant, and its implications for believers.
- **Key Points:**
 - The "taking away" in Hebrews 10:9 refers to the body of Messiah (Yeshua) being lifted up and sacrificed, not the permanent removal of the sacrificial/temple system.
 - Yeshua's sacrifice is unique in that it conquers death, removes the power and consciousness of sin, and offers eternal life—things the Levitical offerings could not accomplish.
 - The Holy Spirit now dwells within believers, sanctifying and cleansing them, with full sanctification realized at the resurrection when believers receive glorified bodies.
 - The Levitical priesthood and temple offerings had a role in purifying sacred space, but only Yeshua's offering purifies eternally.
 - The Torah (God's law) is written on believers' hearts under the New Covenant; it is not abolished but fulfilled and internalized.
 - Forgiveness through Yeshua means there is no longer a need for sin offerings in the new heavens and new earth, though temple offerings may resume in a future earthly context for purposes of sacred space.
 - Believers are urged to hold fast to faith, stimulate one another to love and good deeds (as defined by Torah), and not forsake assembling together.
 - Willful sin after receiving knowledge of the truth leads to judgment;

believers can lose their salvation if they continue in deliberate sin.

- Yeshua is presented as the eternally begotten Son, sharing the same essence and nature as the Father, not merely an adopted or created being.
- Salvation requires ongoing faith and endurance; faith itself is a "work" in the sense of being an active, continual response.
- The New Covenant and Sinai (Mosaic) Covenant are distinct but overlapping; all covenants remain applicable until the new heavens and new earth.

Additional Topics

- **Discipleship and Community:**

- Emphasis on discipleship, living a Torah-pursuant life, and learning from each other in the body of Messiah.
- Encouragement to engage with additional resources, such as YouTube and Spotify channels, and discussions with Rabbi Mitch Chapman.
