

Summary of Hebrews 9 & The Covenants

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Keys of the Kingdom: Hebrews 9 & The Covenants

Main Topic: Exploration of Hebrews Chapter 9 and the Covenants

- The session continues a series on biblical covenants, focusing on Hebrews chapter 9.
- Emphasized that the Abrahamic, Sinai, and New Covenants are all still active and relevant for followers of Yeshua (Jesus), whether Jew or Gentile. All are grafted into Israel, the caretaker of the covenants.
- Addressed a common misconception: The Sinai Covenant (law of Moses) has not ended with the New Covenant. Instead, all covenants work together; none have been abolished.
- The comparison in Hebrews is between the Levitical (earthly) priesthood and Yeshua's eternal, heavenly priesthood. The Levitical priesthood functioned on earth; Yeshua's priesthood operates in the heavenly courts, offering eternal redemption.
- The rituals and offerings under the Levitical system addressed unintentional sins and maintained sacred space but could not perfect the conscience or remove the death curse—only Yeshua's work accomplishes this.
- The term "fulfill" (as in "Yeshua fulfilled the law") means to bring to fullness, not to abolish. Fulfillment does not equate to ending the law or the covenants.
- Ritual acts, such as sacrifices and washings, were imposed until "the time of setting things straight," which is understood as a period of endurance and progressive revelation, not cessation.
- Scriptural examples were provided to demonstrate that "until" in biblical context implies endurance rather than termination.
- The offerings and temple worship, even after Yeshua's work, were not

considered blasphemous or contradictory for believers in the first century—faith in Yeshua is the key, not the ritual itself.

- Yeshua's sacrifice is described as the ultimate, once-for-all offering that perfects and cleanses the believer, removing the power of sin and death.

Questions & Clarifications

- Does Hebrews 9 indicate the end of the Sinai Covenant? No, the covenant continues and remains relevant.
- Is it permissible for followers of Yeshua to participate in temple rituals if the temple is restored? Yes, as long as it is done in faith and accordance with Torah.
- What does "until" mean in covenantal context? It represents endurance, not cessation.

Decisions and Action Plans

- Continue to approach the covenants as active and interrelated, not as superseded.
- Followers are encouraged to obey Torah and participate in acts of worship out of faith and love, recognizing Yeshua as the perfecter of faith.
- Next session will cover Hebrews chapter 10, concluding the series on the covenants.
