The Cross, Redemption & Keys of Death

Main Discussion Topics

1. The Fall, the Death Curse, and the Need for Redemption

- **Key Points:**

- Sin entered the world through Adam's fall (Genesis 3), resulting in the "death curse" for all humanity.
- The doctrine of "original sin" is rejected; people are born innocent but under the curse of death, not as sinners.
- Righteous individuals in the Bible (Abraham, Moses, David) still faced the death curse and could not resurrect themselves.
- The death curse could only be broken by the redemptive work of Yeshua (Jesus).

- **Decisions/Teachings:**

- Emphasis on understanding the biblical narrative from the Tanakh (Hebrew Scriptures) to understand Yeshua's work.

2. Redemption Through Exodus and Passover

- **Key Points:**

- The Exodus story is a foreshadowing of redemption: Israel enslaved in Egypt represents humanity's bondage to sin.
- Deliverance required both God's action and the Israelites' obedience (e.g., Passover lamb, blood on the doorposts).

- Redemption is available to all who have faith, not just Israelites—Gentiles could be redeemed as well.

3. Forgiveness, Repentance, and the Role of Blood

- **Key Points:**

- Forgiveness of sins can occur without the shedding of blood (examples: King David's repentance, Nineveh in Jonah).
- A "broken and contrite heart" is the key to forgiveness, as shown in Psalm 51.
- The sacrificial system (Leviticus 16, Yom Kippur) was primarily about cleansing sacred space, not always about forgiveness.
- The blood of Yeshua is for cleansing—making the worshipper and the "temple" (body) holy.

- **Teaching/Clarification:**

- The distinction is made between forgiveness (which comes through repentance) and deliverance from the death curse (which required Yeshua's sacrifice).

4. Theological Critique: Penal Substitutionary Atonement (PSA)

- **Key Points:**

- The presenter rejects PSA, the teaching that God's wrath was poured out on Yeshua as a substitute for humanity.
- Argues that it would be unjust for Yahweh to punish an innocent in place of the guilty and that it undermines the deity of Yeshua.
- Asserts that Yeshua remained sinless, was not defiled, and that the Father and Son were never separated.

- **Discussion:**

- Emphasis on God's compassion and power to forgive apart from wrath.
- Redemption is about breaking the power of sin and death, not satisfying God's wrath.

5. Yeshua's Victory: The Keys of Death and Hades

- **Key Points:**

- Through His death and resurrection, Yeshua took the "keys of death and Hades" from Satan (Hebrews 2:14, Revelation 1:18).
- The kingdom of darkness (Satan) previously held power over death; Yeshua's sacrificial death and resurrection transferred that authority.
- The cross is framed as a victory over the powers of evil and death, not a transaction to satisfy divine wrath.
- Yeshua's resurrection ensures believers' future resurrection and eternal life.

6. Parables and Practical Application

- **Key Points:**

- The Prodigal Son (Luke 15) and the Forgiving King (Matthew 18) illustrate God's forgiveness and the necessity of forgiving others.
- Believers can lose and regain salvation through their choices (e.g., lack of forgiveness); repentance restores their relationship with God.
- Faith and obedience are necessary for redemption, but ultimate deliverance is a gift of grace from God.

Questions Raised

- Can forgiveness be granted without blood? (Yes, through repentance.)
- Is deliverance from the curse of death possible without blood? (No, requires Yeshua's sacrifice.)
- Did Yeshua bear God's wrath or remain an innocent, willing sacrifice? (Presenter argues the latter.)
- Who had the "keys of death" before Yeshua? (Argued to be Satan.)

Action Plans

- Audience encouraged to study the Hebrew Scriptures to better understand Yeshua's redemptive work.
- Listeners invited to comment and share their perspectives, especially on

atonement and the keys of death.

- Encouragement to move away from certain Western Christian doctrines deemed inaccurate.
- Reminder for personal repentance, faith, and to walk in forgiveness.
